A 3-year-old boy in an orphanage gripped my heart. "Why am I crying?" I had "loved on" other children in the orphanage that were beyond medical assistance & going to die, and I was coping well with that, but not this boy.

He was in a section of mainly infants with special needs & had to stay in his cot due to a pinned leg; had no stimulation of toys/interaction or explanations due to lack of staff.

It took a while to build his trust, but it happened. He smiled. Oh what a beautiful sight! Then he got braver, and lifted his good leg (which had old

burn marks on it) out from under the blanket and towards me so I could tickle it! What a gift of trust I received!

I don't know his name or background. But he is "My Boy!" God connected us, so that he could feel loved and valued, and so that I would keep him in prayer.

My challenge to you: Why not do a team to China and be God's "love with skin on" for these kids? It is SO worth it for their sakes!

Recently we were blessed to have David Goodwin, from Sydney, visit our Xian office to train many of our staff. We also invited some co-workers from partner organisations. We should not only give children their physical needs, a sense of belonging, safety and love, but also let each and every child know they are very important..."
